With rosters that were loaded with Hall of Famers and fan favorites, the Capitol of Baseball is cherished as much now as it was 60 years ago.

Series 2 will have the following teams (odd year National League champions and even year American League champion) Every player in EVERY year has no less than 5 of each in the subset - so there are (15) total Jackie Robinson, (15) total Roy Campanella, (22) total Mickey Mantle, (11) total Joe DiMaggio, (13) total Casey Stengel, (12) total Willie Mays and (14) total Gil Hodges - and one of these players is GUARANTEED in EVERY CASE. Over 40% of the boxes will have Hall of Famers, not to mention those TOUGH autographs of men such as Don Hoak, Elston Howard, Don Bessent, Billy Cox, Carl Furillo, Jim Gilliam, Billy Martin, Joe Page and Hank Thompson.
